Re: Urgent Need to Safeguard LIHEAP During the Government Shutdown

Dear Congressional Leaders:

The undersigned organizations, representing thousands of mostly small, family-owned heating fuel and home-comfort businesses across the United States, write to urge Congress to take immediate, bipartisan action to protect the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) during the current federal government shutdown.

With colder weather now setting in across much of the country, millions of low-income and fixed-income households depend on timely assistance from LIHEAP to stay safe and warm. Yet as the shutdown continues, state and local agencies responsible for administering LIHEAP may experience delays in processing new applications, issuing payments, and authorizing vendor deliveries until federal funding is restored. These delays directly affect vulnerable households and the small businesses that provide their heating fuels.

Most delivered fuel retailers are small, locally owned family businesses that operate on narrow seasonal margins and have limited credit capacity. They employ local technicians, deliver fuel in rural and hard-to-reach communities, and serve as a lifeline for families who have no alternative source of heat. Extended interruptions in LIHEAP funding jeopardize their ability to sustain operations, maintain employment, and continue serving those most in need.

We urge Congress to take immediate action to ensure continued LIHEAP funding throughout any lapse in appropriations, thereby providing urgently needed stability for millions of households and the small businesses that serve them.

Equally critical, we urge you to include language in any funding measure that requires the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to maintain sufficient staffing to effectively administer LIHEAP. The termination of all federal LIHEAP staff, combined with ongoing furloughs and reductions-in-force programs, has left the program critically understaffed, severely limiting the ability to carry out essential functions. As a result, vulnerable households and fuel vendors are going without the vital assistance and guidance they urgently need.

As Congress works toward a comprehensive agreement to reopen the government, we respectfully urge you to act swiftly to:

- Authorize continued LIHEAP operations during any lapse in federal appropriations;
- Ensure that funds already appropriated or obligated for FY 2025 and FY 2026 remain accessible to states and eligible households; and
- Require HHS to maintain adequate staffing levels necessary to administer the program and support state agencies effectively.

Our members take pride in keeping American families warm, safe, and secure every winter. We ask Congress to do the same by ensuring that no family or the small businesses that serve them are left out in the cold because of a budget impasse in Washington.

Thank you for your leadership and for your attention to this urgent matter.
